Pastor Helen's Lenten Sermon Series

When I was in seminary, I was youth director for Central Presbyterian Church in Denver. I hosted a Star Wars Movie Marathan at the request of the youth, and we had a deep theological discussion. The young people debated big questions about the force (i.e the force is not evil or good it just is and it is the way people use the force that makes something good or bad...) That is the inspiration for our Lenten sermon series entitled The Prophets Story.
